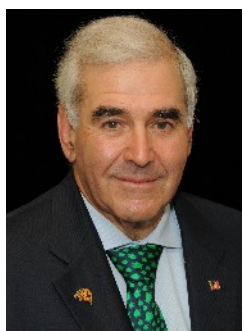


EOEF Presidential Guest Speaker Reinhold Schmieding

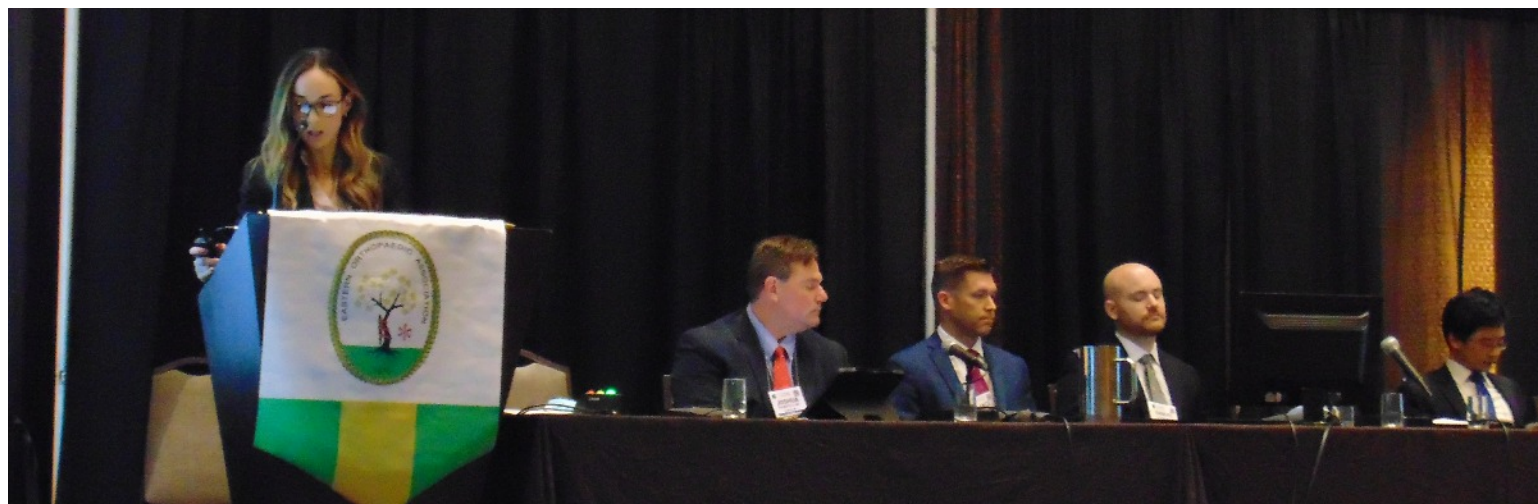
