# EOEF Presidential Guest Speaker William L. Healy, MD

We are excited to have Dr. William L. Healy as the 2025 Presidential Guest Speaker.

Dr. Healy is a Professor of Orthopaedic Surgery at Boston University School of Medicine. He was born in Boston and graduated from Amherst College in 1974. Dr. Healy attended

medical school at SUNY - Downstate, and completed his orthopaedic residency at Johns Hopkins Hospital, followed by an AO/ASIF Adult Reconstruction Fellowship in Austria. After completing his training, he returned to Massachusetts and joined Lahey Clinic, specializing in Adult Reconstruction for the next 28 years, and served as Orthopaedic Surgery Chair from 1991-2012.

Dr. Healy's research interests center around total joint arthroplasty with a focus on surgical technique, implant design and patient outcomes, as well as socioeconomic issues in orthopaedic surgery and orthopaedic education. With more than 160 peer reviewed publications, his contributions to the field will continue to foster orthopaedic research and education in the future. Dr. Healy's numerous awards include the Robert E. Leach Orthopaedic Teaching Award from Boston University, AAHKS' Lawrence Dorr Award, the Arthritis Foundation Physician Achievement Award, the Lahey Clinic Research Award, the Boston University Distinguished Service Award, and the Irish American Orthopaedic Society's Lifetime Achievement Award.

Beginning in 2000, Dr. Healy volunteered for the Ouimet Scholarship Fund, which awards millions of dollars in need-based college scholarships each year, serving on the Board from 2010 to present. In 2022, he and his wife Angela created the Bill & Angela Healy Healthcare Scholarship, awarded annually to a Ouimet scholar pursuing a career in healthcare.

An avid golfer, Dr. Healy has written a series of golf history books on courses across Massachusetts, Wisconsin and Ireland.



# Howard Steel Lecturer Ami Vitale

We are thrilled to have Ami Vitale as the 2025 Howard Steel Lecturer!

Ami is an acclaimed National Geographic photographer, writer, and documentary filmmaker, and through her compelling journalism, she highlights stories of resilience and innovation, emphasizing the delicate balance between humanity and wildlife and the urgent need for conservation. Vitale's work

connects viewers to critical local conservation issues of global importance, while underscoring our interconnectedness with one another and the natural world.

In addition to her journalism and filmmaking, Vitale is the founder and Executive Director of Vital Impacts, a non-profit organization that leverages the power of art to inspire and mobilize youth as agents of change. Vitale and her non-profit have raised over \$5 million to support vital conservation projects.

Ami is an honorary fellow of the Royal Photographic Society and a recipient of the prestigious Lucie Humanitarian Award, the Missouri Honor Media for Distinguished Service, and an inductee into the North Carolina Media and Journalism Hall of Fame. She has also received the Daniel Pearl Award for Outstanding Reporting, been named Magazine Photographer of the Year at the International Photographer of the Year awards, and is a six-time recipient of World Press Photo awards.

Instyle magazine featured Ami alongside Jane Goodall and Ruth Bader Ginsburg in its series "Fifty Badass Women," celebrating women who exemplify courage and action. Ami is Conservation International's Lui-Walton Innovators Fellow. A soughtafter speaker, she continues to share her experiences and insights with audiences worldwide, and in 2025, she will be featured on the National Geographic Channel Explorer TV series.
