### **EOA HUMANITARIAN AWARD** Chitranjan S. Ranawat, MD

Congratulations to Chitranjan S. Ranawat, MD, the 2019 recipient of the EOA Humanitarian Award. Dr. Ranawat, born in Sarwania, India, began his medical education and Orthopaedic residency training in India. His training continued in the United States with fellowships in hand surgery and then reconstructive surgery at the Hospital for Special Surgery from 1966 to 1969. He became an Attending Orthopaedic surgeon at the Hospital for Special Surgery in 1969 and practiced at that institution until 1994 when he moved his practice to Lenox Hill Hospital. There, Dr. Ranawat served as The James A. Nicholas Chairman of the Department of Orthopaedic Surgery and the Director of the Ranawat Orthopaedic Center. He was the Founder and President of the Knee Society and President of the Hip Society from which he has also received Lifetime Achievement Awards.

His greatest satisfaction has come from educating orthopaedic surgeons from all over the world. In 1986 he founded the Ranawat Orthopaedic Research Foundation, a philanthropic organization to fund an Annual meeting in India for the last 18 years. In 2001, he received the Padma Bhushan, the third highest Indian civilian award for his charitable and educational giving.
